A Letter from our Rector

Life is Changed at Saint Margaret's

It is the month of September, and at Saint Margaret's, we find ourselves saying goodbye to our dear friends and members of the clergy, Fr. Lito+ and Fr. Eric+. While I never expected these departures to occur so close together, they are a result of God's call for each one of them. For Fr. Lito+, a call to the retired life after 47 years of faithful ministry. For Fr. Eric+, the exciting call to lead a congregation as its next rector. They both have been important parts of our community at Saint Margaret's, and we let them each go, both with feelings of sadness and joy. Our prayers go with each of them and their families as they embark on God's journey into their next ministry.

Many of you have already contacted me directly to ask about the future plans in augmenting our clergy staff. Instinctively, those who have reached out understand that our parish is too large and has too many needs for one clergy to cover. I love you all dearly, and my first priority is to assure as best as I am able that the spiritual and sacramental needs of this parish community are being offered in a faithful way. That is my responsibility as your spiritual leader, and I want you to know that I am already in deep prayer to discern what God's desire is for us going forward together. First and foremost, Saint Margaret's is here so that we can all foster a deeper relationship with Jesus and with one another. Please know that your Vestry and I are already in prayer and conversation about the calling of an additional priest to join our ministry staff and to partner with us in the important kingdom building work that we are called together to do.

With that being said, we are not going to rush ahead too quickly on this or any other decision. Given the uncertainties brought to us throughout 2020, we need to proceed very deliberately in any future plans that we make at our parish. In order to call an experienced priest to serve with us, the Vestry needs to assess our financial strength for the future, and to balance the need to call a second priest to Saint Margaret's, while at the same time committing to the current staff and assuring that they remain with us as we navigate through this pandemic. This means that the upcoming stewardship drive for our church will be of vital importance. What I do know about Saint Margaret's is that when there is a need, you respond. As we enter the fall, and our society and church begin to open up (albeit ever so slowly) please remember that the next few months will be pivotal for our parish.

As best as you are able, please continue to support the ministry of this church, so that we can transform our community, grow in our relationship with Jesus, take care of our beautiful building, and support the staff that we need to continue to grow our ministry in our area, our diocese, and the world.Personally, I would also like to ask for your prayers and patience.

I am currently reworking our plans for the eventual reopening of our church for worship. Know that because I am your only priest, it will affect the number of worship services that we will hold for the next few months, and it will be difficult to manage all of the needs of the parish. But please know this; I will not be too busy to connect with you if you need me. It may look different for a while (i.e. digitally) but if you need me, please call me. If you need prayer, I will pray with you. Do not ever think that I am too busy to have a conversation with you or to pray with you when the need arises. God has got this, and He will show us the way forward together. In the meantime, please pray for me as I will pray for you.

oodhye Saying

Dear St. Margaret's,

I have found that one of the hardest parts of my vocation as a priest is saying goodbye. I have gotten to know so many of you as you have invited me into your homes, attended one of my programs, or chatted about life in the office or halls of the parish. For each of you, I am immensely grateful. I have been so fortunate to begin my priestly ministry in this healthy and faithful parish and to have shared this ministry with one of the best church staff I have ever been apart. You have a lot to be proud of and thankful for in this place.

Eugene Vodolazkin's adventurous novel Laurus tells the story of a medieval Russan Orthodox healer Arseny, as he makes a pilgrimage through plaguestricken Europe and eventually to the Holy Land. For a brief moment in his journey, Arseny is accompanied by a Franciscan monk, Brother Hugo. When they part ways Brother Hugo says with watery eyes, "Sometimes, you wonder

if it is worth getting attached to people if it will be this difficult to part with them." With an embrace, Arseny responds, "You know, O friend, any meeting is surely more than parting. There is an emptiness before meeting someone, just nothing, but there is no longer emptiness after parting. After having met someone once, it is impossible to part completely. A person remains in the memory, as a part of the memory. The person created that part, and that part lives, sometimes coming into contact with its creator. Otherwise, how would we sense those dear to us from a distance?"

I am grateful for the former absence in my memory that St. Margaret's now fills. I will continue to take comfort in knowing we can never part completely as God holds us together, always, in this one body, the Church. I hope that you will hold me in your prayers as Brandie and I follow God's call to serve St. Paul's in Clinton. You will remain in ours.

EYC is back

The Episcopal Diocese of North Carolina has recently given permission for churches to host in-person social gatherings for students! These gatherings must be outside and will follow all of the protocol you have come to expect: masks are required, students should bring their own tailgate chairs, and students not in the same household must maintain a minimum six feet distance from others. There will be no shared items and no meals will be served. Signups are required and groups must be kept to a maximum of ten students.

Even with all those things mentioned above, all I can say is how excited I am to see our students! Truly, words cannot express my excitement to see each one of them in-person. Your children are an integral part of my life and I have missed our group so much.

As we all are all too aware of, life is constantly in flux these days.

We have a brand-new curriculum for Christian Education at St. Margaret's, based on Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's The Way of Love.





Lessons begin the week of September 6th. We look forward to sharing this curriculum with you and walking in the Way of Love.








CHILDREN'S MINISTRY
