With that in mind, I wanted to bring to your attention a particular area in which your Vestry is currently engaged. One can't escape the divisiveness currently being seen in our country and culture, as well as witnessing in our news the horrific instances of violence in schools.

churches, and other public areas. And while we can't seal ourselves off from the world, it is prudent to evaluate our current church security protocols for effectiveness and make changes to mitigate any potential risk.

A committee within the Vestry has been hard at work surveying area churches on their current procedures, hosting the Union County Sheriff's Department in an assessment of our property, and reaching out to internal ministries and stakeholders to understand the impact enhanced security measures may have on their operations and resources.

Based on this feedback and recommendations, we are evaluating new measures in the areas of access to the building, more efficient alarm/security systems including camera placement, and the potential for some type of police presence on our campus. Our campus has many access points and an immediate recommendation from the sheriff's department that has been implemented is to keep all doors locked during our worship service times with visitors utilizing the doors to the Narthex only.

FOR YOUR SAFETY



The Union County Sherriff's Department strongly recommends limiting access to our building during worship services to the two sets of doors leading into the Narthex. All other doors will remain locked. This is part of an ongoing effort to upgrade and enhance our current fire and safety emergency preparedness procedures at St. Margaret's.

We appreciate your patience as we continue to evaluate our plans and will communicate any further changes that are required. We apologize for any inconvenience or change of routine this may cause.

REMINDERS:

- We have two **AED**s in the building in case of a medical emergency. One in the cry room at the back of the church and one in the school hallway. Both are labeled for your direction.
- **FIRST AID KITS** are available in the vesting room (across from the cry room) and on the wall in the school hallway near the AED. There is also one in the church office workroom.
- Please accompany children to the playground, rest rooms and water fountain for their safety.
