# I'm Thankful for the 65%!

The Episcopal Church has recently released their latest report on church attendance. For many years, mainline churches have seen a steady decline in church membership and attendance, and this trend was greatly accelerated during the lockdowns of the pandemic. The latest data reveals that the Episcopal Church nationally has seen a decrease in worship attendance of 35% of its membership, a drastic decline to say the least. At Saint Margaret's, we have locally experienced that exact same reality. Before the pandemic, Saint Margaret's would average 390 people in worship on any given weekend. Today, that number is 220. As you can imagine, this has created much consternation amongst the leadership and the clergy of the church, and I do have to admit that I have not been immune from some of that worry. I love our church so deeply and want nothing more than for it to continue to thrive and bear witness to the Risen Lord.

But a funny thing happened to me while I was on sabbatical. One of the things that I love about walking portions of the Camino is that it offers me the chance to let go of all distractions and to really focus of God's voice and what He might be trying to say to me. At some point on my walk, God whispered to me to stop worrying about His Church, and to spend more of my time in gratitude for the faithful disciples whom I have been called to serve. I found that message so liberating, and frankly so helpful. This parish has hundreds of faithful souls that are committed to worship, committed to prayer, and committed to the building of God's Kingdom. I returned from sabbatical not only personally refreshed and re-energized, but more importantly, profoundly grateful for this church and the people who have dedicated themselves to our shared vision and ministry, and who walk together in faith to follow Jesus and build His Kingdom!

As Jesus began to show Himself to His disciples after His resurrection, Jesus found a very small group of followers who were scared, uncertain, and anxious. As Jesus prepared to ascend to His Father, He left them with these words:

Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Eleven disciples. Eleven disciples that changed the world! The Risen Lord rose from the dead, and these eleven, faithful souls went into the world and proclaimed Jesus as King. Jesus said to go, and they went. Jesus told them to baptize everyone, and the revolution grew by billions. Jesus promised that he would be with them always, and He still is!

The call is the same for us. Go, and share the Good News. Baptize all people. Teach others the way of Jesus. Love Jesus, Love your Neighbor, and Bless the World. And always, always, trust that He is with us.


