a Command to Love

Years ago, after a long Sunday of worship, I stopped at a local restaurant to get a quick bite to eat before I returned home. If I am being totally open and honest, I was tired, a bit cranky, and not much in the mood for conversation. The morning worship was glorious, but it had taken every bit of energy that I had, and I just wanted to go home and relax. As I sat down to eat, I noticed a gentleman looking at me the entire time. Once I was settled at my table, he picked up his plate and proceeded to come over and sit himself right next to me. I was taken a back, and I wasn't quite sure where this was heading. He looked at me, pulled out a bible, and asked me, "Do you believe this or not?" Direct, to the point, and frankly, not an inappropriate question to ask a priest! I swallowed the bite of food in my mouth, took a deep breath, and answered. "Yes. I do. Every word of *it!*"

I know that sounds a little crazy, but I really do believe this book, believe its story, and believe that it contains all things necessary for our salvation. It bears witness to the story of God and His people, and to His Son Jesus coming to dwell among us. Jesus came to show us a new way of being human, and I believe this new way of humanity is how God works His purposes in the world, even when the way of Jesus seems so different from our own instincts!

For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me. (Matt 25: 35-36)

This section of the Gospel of Matthew contains a central teaching of our Lord. We are called to love our neighbor, will the good of the other, and work for that good to become a reality. I highlight this section of the Gospel because I would like to invite everyone to a threeweek course that will be offered this January during the Adult Formation hour on Sunday mornings (9:30-10:15) that will help us to live out our Christian love of others. Keith Adams, a parishioner and Co-founder and Executive Director of Common Heart, will present the Bridges out of Poverty Workshop for our parish.

A fuller description is contained within this newsletter, and I commend it to you for your reflection and consideration. I believe that Saint Margaret's is uniquely situated to have a positive impact in our community and can powerfully live out our Gospel calling to love our neighbors, and to use our abundant resources for the good of our wider community.

To believe in Jesus also means to follow, as best we can, all His teachings, even the hard ones. It can be so easy to forget that even in our little section of the world, families struggle with food insecurity, struggle to pay bills, and sometimes lose hope of life ever changing for their families. I would offer to you that Jesus called us here, in this place, to do our best to help. Our Lord calls us to center our lives not on ourselves, but on Him, and in doing so to show love and charity to our neighbors. Jesus ends this discourse with these words:

"Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

Direct, to the point, and a call for all of us. I believe it. Every word of it. Come join us and let us learn to live it together!

NEW! 3 week Sunday School workshop:

Bridges out of Poverty

Jan. 15, 22, 29th at 9:30 in the Parish Hall Please join us for this important discussion!



Jesus was clear in his command to love and care for neighbor. To equip us to follow that command effectively, we present a 3 week Sunday School workshop, Bridges Out of Poverty. Bridges is a framework for understanding poverty, developing relationships of mutual respect, and improving the lives of neighbors living with a lack of resources.

We will examine:

- mental models
- hidden rules
- driving forces of economic class stratification
- the causes of poverty
- and the 11 resources needed to move out of poverty and the skills required to love an serve our neighbors better.

These 3 sessions are an introduction and overview of the Bridges Out of Poverty Curriculum. Keith Adams, Co-founder and Executive Director of Common Heart and Co-founder, President of Thrive! Union, an anti-poverty, upward mobility collaborative in Union County NC and St. Margaret's parishioner will facilitate this study.

Keith Adams is a certified Bridges Our of Poverty and Workplace Stability instructor and a facilitator of Getting Ahead in a "Just Gettin'-by" World that is a starting point for new future stories for families living in generational poverty.
