From the Rector

For My Yoke is Easy, and My Burden is Light

Cruz de Hierro, or the Iron Cross, is the highest point on the Camino Frances route of the Camino de Santiago in Spain. I have journeyed to this summit twice; once in 2015 on my solo expedition, and once with Reg in 2016 when we walked a 200-mile section together. The last five miles approaching this Cross is a continual ascent, but curiously is not particularly difficult to trek. What is most powerful about this spot is the Cross itself and what surrounds it. Thousands of rocks are laid by pilgrims each year at the base of this Cross.These stones have been carried by pilgrims for hundreds of miles and symbolize a particular burden or struggle that one carries with them in their life. Once at the foot of the Cross, and having carried this rock and prayed for relief for hundreds of miles, the pilgrim then leaves their burden and moves on, refreshed and with a lighter burden.

Lent is a season gifted to us by the Church that allows us to focus on those things that burden our souls and keep us from a full and transformed relationship with Jesus. People think I'm crazy when I say this, but Lent is my favorite season of the Church year. I love the intentional quiet time that I spend in deep contemplation, naming those struggles in my life that weigh me down and keep me from the new life that our Lord has offered me. Through worship, prayer, self-denial and the contemplation of Holy Scripture, it is a season that allows me to get real with myself and with God about those things I do that I shouldn't, and about those things I don't do that I should. And the wonderful truth I experience in these Lenten disciplines is the mercy of Jesus that always awaits me. Centering on Jesus, and being

honest with Him, always opens the door to refreshment, renewal, and God relieving the burdens which so often encumber me. As Jesus promises us in Matthew:

Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy and My burden is light.

Would you like to be more at peace in your life? Is there a particular sin you grapple with that weighs down your soul? Friends, I tell you Jesus is waiting for you at this very moment to change your life. This Lent, take your burdens to Him, and if you journey the Lenten path to get to Him, you will find true peace and amazing refreshment. For the yoke of Jesus is easy, and His burden is light, and He wants to share that with you today.

May the Peace of our Lord be with you during this holy Season of Lent.

Choral Evensong for St. Joseph

Sunday, March 19th at 4pm

Our invitation to a holy Lent charges us, among other things, to observe the season through prayer and the reading of, and meditating upon, God's holy Word. On the evening of Sunday, March 19, we have a special opportunity to fulfill that charge as a community. At four o'clock, the Adult Choir will offer a beautiful service of Choral Evensong, a treasured part of our Anglican tradition. As part of your Lenten observance, I invite you to join us as we sanctify our evening in song and prayer.

The Church has historically had two liturgies which comprise its public prayer: The Holy Eucharist and the Daily Office. These days, the Holy Eucharist is our customary liturgy for Sunday mornings, but the Daily Office has sadly become rarer. The Daily Office ("office" in the sense of a duty) is a schedule of prayers said throughout each day. The ancient Office prescribed eight liturgies said at intervals of three hours; in the English Reformation, this was simplified to Morning Prayer (sometimes called Mattins) and Evening Prayer (Evensong). These changes combined the older liturgies and expanded the use of scripture in them, with the aim of making their usage more widely accessible to laity and parish churches.

Evensong is a fusion of Vespers, traditionally said before dinner, and Compline, prayers before bed. The general structure is simple: the liturgy begins with a selection of Psalms and continues with readings. The readings are usually more substantial than those used for the Eucharist and draw from more of scripture than the Eucharistic lectionary. Each reading is followed by a scriptural canticle; first the Song of Mary from Vespers, to celebrate God's faithfulness throughout the day, and then the Song of Simeon from Compline, through which we pray to God for a peaceful rest. Then the liturgy concludes with a set of prayers and responses in which we pray for the world and ourselves.

As the Daily Office became the dominant form of worship in the English church, its celebration became marked, particularly in large churches and cathedrals, by greater beauty and splendor.

Composers wrote numerous choral settings of the responses, the inclusion of an anthem became de rigueur, and the canticles after the readings were written with increasing drama and beauty into some of the most celebrated works of the whole English repertoire. Today, the celebration of Choral Evensong is an opportunity to step out of the stress and distraction of everyday life and to focus on prayer, scripture, and an encounter with God through beauty. Articles in Christianity Today and the Telegraph have noted, in the past decade, the increasing popularity of Choral Evensong among diverse university students in the UK. Students of varied faith backgrounds, or none, flock to chapels to take a pause in their week and experience something out of the ordinary. In my experience, Evensong attracts this kind of seeker in a way that nothing else can. So join us in setting aside some time the evening of March 19 to hear God's word, enjoy some beautiful music, and pray with us as we continue on in our Lenten journey.

There's nothing quite like a tangible, likely a little messy, activity to allow for a lasting impression and memory of what has been studied and discussed at youth group.
